




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Introduction

The Judith and Marvin Herb Family Simulation Center is one of SWFL's largest simulation centers that is truly multidisciplinary. The center is within a 12,000 square foot space at NCH Healthcare System in Naples, FL. The center focuses on training healthcare professionals to acquire, maintain, and enhance their skills in a state-of-the-art , high-fidelity training center. The center also extends the benefits of simulation to community members like high-schools, youth organizations, foundations, first responders, and other clients.

The Judith and Marvin Herb Family Simulation Center opened its doors in March of 2020 in a state-of-the-art, high-fidelity temporary simulation center at NCH Healthcare System. This 8,000 square foot space made it possible to have two acute care simulation rooms, control room, an outpatient office/clinic, a procedural skills lab, classroom and a debriefing room. This temporary space allowed the organization to train their learners while the permanent 12,000 square foot space was being built with a completion date of 2023. During this time, we were able to perform a needs assessment to cater our new simulation center build to the organizations and learners needs.

Our new Simulation Center has two debriefing rooms, three classrooms, a fully functioning cardiovascular operating room suite, a procedural skills lab that flexes into another operating room suite, an outpatient clinic room, a moulage room, a green room for our standardized patient program/actors, a labor and delivery/NICU simulation room, an ICU/Emergency Department simulation room, two other flex simulation rooms, two large control rooms, and an Immersive Interactive room by ECHO Healthcare. The Simulation Center Team takes pride in enhancing the learners environments into a realistic clinical setting. The team can replicate almost any clinical or nonclinical setting providing the highest realism possible.



Introduction

The year 2022 witnessed tremendous growth and expansion of the Judith and Marvin Herb Family Simulation Center. The new center opened in January 2023, occupying 12,000 square foot of space in the previous CVRU location at Baker Hospital.

This past year saw many accomplishments and milestones including Hope Goodwin achieves accreditation/board certification in Simulation Medicine as a Certified Healthcare Simulation Educator (CHSE). Julio and I presented at the IMSH International Medical Simulation in Healthcare Meeting with an invited workshop titled "Ballistic Gel Vascular Access and Wound Trainer Workshop".

The Simulation Center welcomed a new member to the team Cameron Blaquire as the Simulation Coordinator and Standardized Patient Program Advocate.

The new simulation center was designed around the needs of the NCH Healthcare Staff with multiple classrooms, workrooms, five simulation rooms, one operating room, one procedural skills room, two debriefing rooms, and an exciting edition of an Immersive Room which is a form of mixed reality and augmented reality to improve the training of both healthcare and non-healthcare personnel. The center remains focused around meeting the needs of every employee at NCH with the goals of improved patient safety and outcomes, improving confidence, increasing job satisfaction along with recruitment and retention.

The center during 2022 conducted 804 classes with nearly 10,000 learner hours! Very impressive for the first year of operations. A wide range of partners and groups have utilized the simulation center. Examples include impressive multidisciplinary simulation training with the operating room team, simulated a fire in the OR, labor and delivery simulation complicated birthing scenarios, and recently the Cardiac Catheterization labs conducting simulations including code blue/cardiac arrests, transporting a critical patient from the North campus to Downtown campus with multiple devices including intubation, mechanical ventilation, and intra-aortic balloon pump. The simulation team has also extended the benefits of simulation to local schools and first responders.

Looking Ahead

The simulation center is completely supported financially by philanthropy and the generosity of our community. We look forward to 2023 with continued focus support and advocacy of every section and employee at NCH while improving patient safety and outcomes optimizing the sense of purpose, strength and being a part of NCH.

Simulation Coordinator and Organizer of Standardized Patient Program





Learner Hours






Child birth simulator "Victoria" by Gaumard


Inter-agency Collaboration

Achievements & Milestones



Hope Goodwin, Operations Manager of Judith & Marvin Herb Family Simulation Center has joined over 2,200 Simulationists from 37 countries by obtaining her International SSIH Board Certification in Simulation Education (CHSE). This certification is recognized by ANCC Magnet. Research has demonstrated that individuals who obtain certification make decisions with greater confidence and adhere to the current evidence and guidelines set forth by the Society for Simulation in Healthcare. This is a formal certification that validates the expertise, skills, attitude, and experiences of the individual.



The Judith and Marvin Herb Family Simulation Center was recognized by Project Search as Department of the month. The Simulation Center Team serves as mentors for the Project Search students every school year. The center teaches the students basic work and life skills by allowing them to participate and work in the Simulation Center.

The Judith and Marvin Herb Family Simulation Center Team assisted NCH Hospital in the delivery and training of over 2,000 LifeVacs to first responders, emergency departments, and other departments and agencies. These devices will assist in choking cases.



In 2021, we invited surrounding nursing programs to be included in our multidisciplinary medical resident simulations. We had participation from Florida SouthWestern State College, Rasmussen College, Southern Technical College, Keiser, and FGCU SRNA students



In 2022 we welcomed our first group of Pulmonary/Critical Care Fellows and Cardiology Fellows to NCH. The Critical Care Fellows had their first week of ICU bootcamp training in the simulation center.



The Simulation Center staff and the Nurse Educators trained the entire OR staff during an exciting packed 2-day multidisciplinary simulation involving high risk low occurrence scenarios that happen in the OR. We hosted over 100 learners in the 2-day training!
